



An Affordable Supportive Housing Program

Booth Brown House Foyer is housing for young people ages 16 to 21 who are seeking independent living. Foyer's on-site support and integrated services help young people make the transition to independence by providing affordable housing, life-skills training and links to employment and education.

Each tenant rents a single-room apartment with a kitchenette and bath on a month-to-month basis. The tenant and case manager work together to develop and implement a living plan that fosters independence, self-sufficiency, self-esteem and opportunities for personal growth. The goal of the Booth Brown House Foyer program is to prepare youth for less-restrictive housing and higher levels of independence.

The Young People We Serve

Initial consideration:

- Youth leaving home for the first time
- Youth who have failed out-of-home placement or have had a previous failure in independent living
- Youth from broken or dysfunctional homes
- Youth aging out of foster care or shelter care
- Youth lacking parent, family or peer support systems
- Homeless youth

Eligibility criteria:

- An ability to maintain housing with minimal supervision
- A desire to create healthy support systems for oneself
- Potential to increase income through employment or public benefits, engage in education or training, or pursue employment
- 120 days of documentable sobriety and a willingness to continue participation in out-patient treatment or support groups
- A willingness to participate in case management and work toward mutually established goals

A Staff that Cares

The staff of the Booth Brown House Foyer includes resident assistants, a vocational education specialist, a rent administrator/property manager and a case manager to assist tenants in setting and achieving their goals. All staff members encourage and support tenant self-sufficiency and mastery.
